This academic year, PhD, other students and alumni can audit the course, with course work optional. Each week has a specific theme, comprising theory, practice and a case study/interview with contributions from our expert team of seasoned entrepreneurs and professionals. Assessment will be course work based comprising a proof-of-concept, pitch deck, business plan and marketing video. Lectures will be on Fridays 3.00-6.00pm in Chadwick B05 LT)
