This statement is a joint statement by the National Association of Principal Educational Psychologists Executive group, the Division of Educational and Child Psychology, British Psychological Society and the Educational Psychology National Training Providers.

We acknowledge that the current situation is extremely challenging for some Trainee Educational Psychologists (TEPs) and that solutions need to be found quickly to support current cohorts.

The issues of TEP remuneration and conditions of service on placement are linked to a broader set of complex challenges across the EP training route as an entire system. The recent workforce survey by Warwick university should, longer term, support a review of the
