





From April 1 1963, Dr M. A. K. Halliday was appointed to


the newly established Directorship of the Communication Research

One of the Research Assistants, Miss Anne P. Duckworth, was appoint



November 1960 on a short-term appointment and is shortly leaving to result his normal work in Warsaw. He will be replaced by Mr J. Svartvik, from Uppsala.

The Survey had only just begun in Durham when, on the Director's appointment to University College, it moved to London where the work has greatly benefited from access to superior libraries and close contact wi interested scholars and organisations. On the other hand - naturally enough in view of the space limitations in University College - it has b necessary to make do with drastically less accommodation than that made available in the Durham Colleges.
