- 3. **UPDATED CAPITAL PROGRAMME CPSC DECISIONS** [APPENDIX EMC 3-1 (14/15)]
 - 3.1 **Received:** The Committee considered the Capital Programme update at <u>EMC 3-1</u> (14/15). The latest forecast capital programme, which had been updated to include new project requests, scope changes and revised cost estimates, indicated an additional requirement of £42.4m. This included a number of business cases which had been presented to the Capital Programme Sub Committee (CPSC) as well as expenditure profile changes resulting from the reforecast and revised inflation assumptions based on the latest available external data.
 - 3.2 The Committee discussed the increase in the cost of the latest forecast capital programme. It was noted that CPSC was working to identify projects for deferral from the approved 10 year programme to ensure that the overall cost remained within the approved funding envelope. CPSC would consider options at its next meeting on 25 February 2015. An updated 10 year capital programme would then be submitted to the next meeting of EMC on 11 March 2015 for consideration. This would include the capital programme for the UCL Institute of Education.
 - 3.3 The Committee discussed the latest cost estimate for the New Student Centre, which indicated that an increased budget would be required in addition to the £3.6m already approved for the Wilkins Node, which had been reallocated to this project. The Committee noted its strong support for this development and the opportunity it presented to improve the student experience and optimise space in Bloomsbury. However, some concern was expressed at the expected scale of increase of the budget and the Committee noted the need for the cost of this project to be contained.
