
Social Data Institute Summer Internship Scheme



Hire UCL students with data skills for a project this summer

UCL Social Data Institute provides some of the most extensive training in quantitative methods to undergraduates anywhere in the UK.

Students receive hands-on training in our innovative and inter-disciplinary degree programmes that focus on the research process: experimental and non- experimental research design; identifying and asking good research questions; how to observe and measure concepts; choosing the right analytic technique; necessary application of statistical computation; visualizing data; communicating the results.

Now in its 8th year, the internship programme places students with organisations either already working with data or who need some temporary data expertise.

What can a Social Data Institute intern do for my organisation?

Student interns can provide a range of benefits to organisations by:

- x Contributing to data analysis/research for an ongoing project
- x Merging/cleaning/preparing datasets for use
- x Contributing to writing up of analyses for reports
- x Investigating data that has been unexplored due to low capacity or expertise



The details

If you participate in the scheme, we ask that:

- x Internships are around 6 weeks in length (mid June September)
- x Your organisation pays the student a wage of at least London Living Wage (£11.95/hr 2023) Interns are assigned a supervisor from your organisation to support their work

If you are interested in hiring a UCL Social Data Institute student on a summer internship, we will send you a short form to provide information about the post, a brief description of the work the student would be doing, and the skill level required.

Students apply for roles in April, and the UCL Social Data Institute will send you a shortlist of applicants to interview in May, with internships commencing in June/July/August 2024. All internships should be completed by the EHJLQQLeQterober 2024.
